Why is it so hot?! – *Ashley Prescod*

Every year it feels like it is getting hotter and hotter. The sun is so hot that it feels like I'm in the Sahara Desert instead of Kumamoto, Japan. Scientists have found three reasons as to why it was getting hot: human-influenced climate change, ocean warming, and El Niño.

Human-influenced climate change - Ever since the steam engine (蒸気機関), humans have been burning more and more fossil fuels (coal, oil, etc.) for energy. The problem is that burning fossil fuels (化石燃料の燃焼) releases CO₂ into the air, which creates a blanket that traps the hot air in, making it hotter.

 $Ocean \ warming$ - Everyone likes a good hot tub (温泉), but what most people don't know is that water vapor (水蒸気) is also a greenhouse gas that increases CO_2 . As the temperature of the Earth rises, the ocean absorbs (吸収する) that heat and releases not only heat but also water vapor, leading to one of the main causes of our heat waves (熱波).

El Niño - El Niño (which means "boy" in Spanish) happens when the wind moves from west to east instead of east to west. Normally, when the winds go from east to west, they carry warm water, and this raises the water level and helps ocean life and agriculture (農業). But when they blow from west to east, something strange happens: The warm water reaches deeper into the ocean, killing ocean life and fish. There is also a decrease in moisture (水分) and the lower sea levels cause droughts (干ばつ) and heat waves. There is no way to predict (予測する) when El Niño will hit, but the number of times El Niño happens has increased with rising temperatures.

So, what should do you do in the heat? Try and stay cool. Make sure you drink a lot of water and eat well. Use sunscreen and try not to be in the sun for too long if you can help it. It's going to be hot this summer, so be careful. Also, let's work hard to take care of our environment and reduce the use of fossil fuels to save our planet!

But the best part of County Fairs is that it <u>brings</u> the community together (人を集める) and helps people to sell their local products. <u>Animal farmers</u> (動物農家) bring their best animals, so you can walk around and look at cows, <u>sheep</u> (羊), pigs, chickens, <u>goats</u> (ヤギ), rabbits, and <u>ducks</u> (アヒル). Children who are in culture clubs can show what they have made that year, like <u>sewing projects</u> (縫い物) or artwork. Farmers who grow fruits and vegetables can show their best <u>crops</u> (作物). In my city, we even have a contest to see who can grow the biggest pumpkin!

Even though it is very hot during the day, at night it cools down and all of the rides and food stalls <u>light up</u> (イルミネーションがある). It looks so cool! If you are ever in America, please go experience the magic of County Fairs in the summer!
